

# PAST TENSE AND -ED ADJECTIVES PRONUCIATION

## RULES

1. When the regular verb or adjective ends in a **vowel sound** or voiced consonant sound ('R', 'B', 'G', 'L', 'M', 'N', 'V', 'Y', 'Z') the -ed is pronounced as /d/.

**Example:** Imagined

2. When the regular verb or adjective ends in an unvoiced consonant sound

('P', 'F', 'S', 'CH', 'SH', 'K', 'X') the -ed is pronounced as /t/.


**Example:** Watched

3. If the regular verb or adjective ends in 'D' or 'T' the -ed is pronounced as /id/.

**Example:** Wanted
